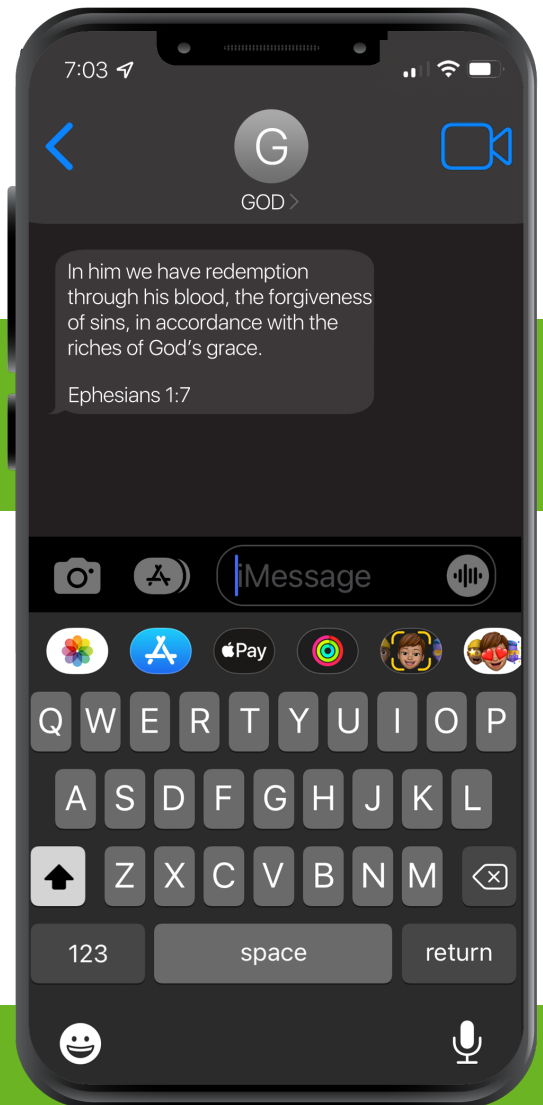

For the Team

Remind them they are not held captive by their sin, but they are free indeed. And with that freedom, they can do amazing things. They can love God's creation the way Jesus did, and show the world they're redeemed too.

For the Special Agents

This week, we'll play 9 Square in the Air (or The Floor is Lava, if you don't have the equipment for 9 Square). Use your Special Agents to help "save" the agents before they get out during 9 square, or during The Floor is Lava, let the Special Agents help the agents get from safe place to safe place. Let them give a helping hand, to redeem the players as they move through the game. Show them all how much easier the game is with this helping hand, and remind them how Jesus paid a debt we could never hope to pay. And for that we are grateful!



C larity

God had a plan from the very beginning. Jesus is our ultimate redeemer. He paid for our sins on the cross, forever redeeming us from the debt we owed to God. John 3:16 clearly explains why this redemption was necessary: Love. God loves us and wants to be with us. But we sinned, and our sin separated us from God. So, he rescued us. He made a way. He redeemed us through Jesus.

Imagine how the disciples felt after Jesus went back to heaven, and they were left with the great commission. They're hopes were confirmed. He is the messiah. They are redeemed. It's no wonder the church grew in leaps and bounds during that time period. They'd seen miracles with their own eyes. They'd been saved from sin and death. And they knew how others could be saved too. Why wouldn't they tell the world?

A pplication

Walking in the redemption of Jesus means being grateful for His sacrifice every day. It means showing people God's love no matter what. It means remembering you didn't earn it, and neither did that person who cut you off in line. It means loving everyone like Jesus.

IRL: In Real Life

The teacher stood in front of her sixth grade English class frowning. They were her toughest class of the day. They were rowdy, loud, and uncaring. That's not to say all of them were like that, but the handful who wanted to learn were always drowned out by the ones that didn't. The ones that caused a commotion every day.

She'd tried everything she could think of to reach them, and as they stared at each other on the last day, the day they were to take their final exam, she knew most of the class would fail. They hadn't done the work all year long.

A spit ball sailed past her ear and landed on the white board behind her. She ignored it.

"Today, I must say, your transgressions have been great in my class."

"Transgressions?" One of the students asked.

"Mistakes," another student filled in.

"Sins," someone else offered.

"Indeed," the teacher continued. "I'm afraid most of you will fail my class."

A great cry rose in her class, but she knew it was coming. She waited patiently for it to die down.

"Most of you have done nothing to earn a passing grade in my class. So explain to me why I owe you anything, when you owe me everything?"

"Because, you care." A shy boy in the back said. He was not failing the class. One of only five students with an A.

"I do care. I care a great deal about you all. But I care more about the lessons you learn here. If you fail, will you learn something from it? Will you try harder next year?"

She looked at them. Most of them hadn't gotten the way they were overnight. It had taken years of being overlooked and ignored for them to take such a careless approach to her class.

"I'm not so sure. And so, I will give you something you didn't earn. I will redeem your grades."

The class erupted in hooting and hollering. "If," she shouted over the chaos. "Each of you can tell me one thing you learned in my class this year."

They went around the room, and the kids offered her more insight than she'd gotten all year, their gratitude plain on their faces.

"Now, next year, maybe you won't find yourself in this position. Carry that gratitude with you."

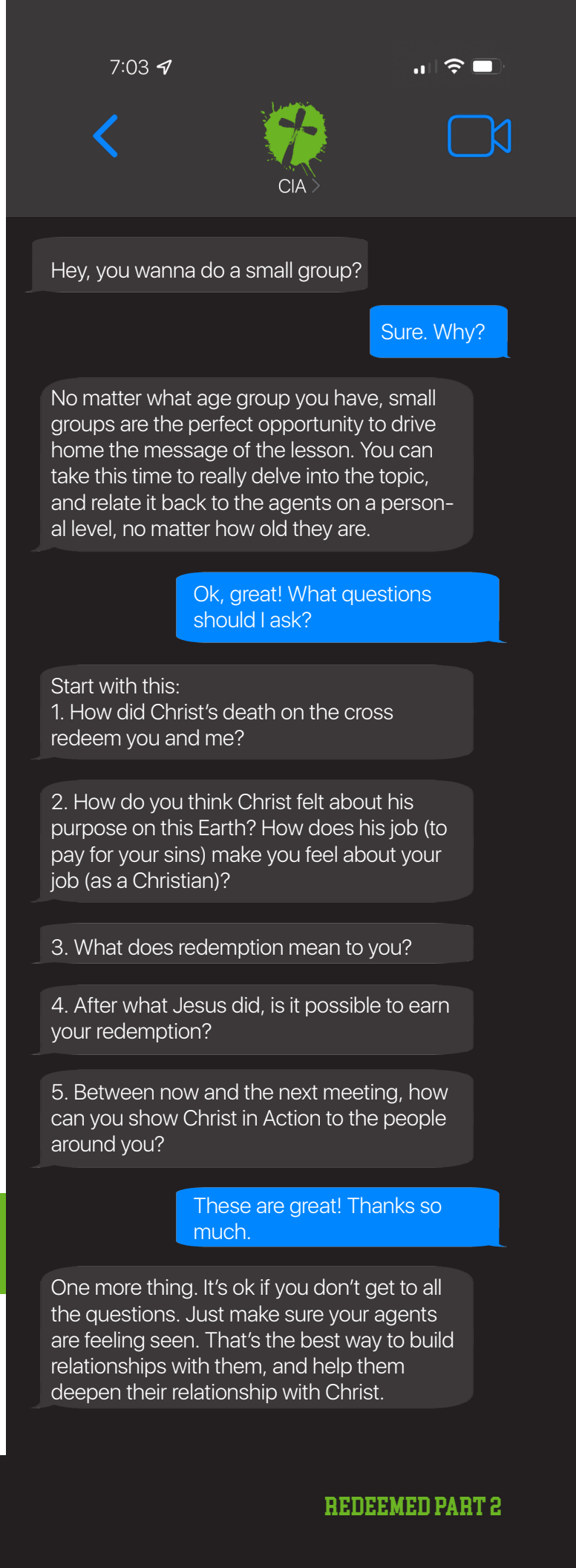
Let's Play

Be sure to check in on some older prayers and see which ones have been answered, and offer praise for those that have.
